If you are between 5 and 12 years old, you could win prizes! Eight weekly winners (one from each week) will be selected to receive a set of books. A grand prize winner will be selected at the end of the contest to receive an e-Reader courtesy of The Oklahoman. The grand prize winner's local library will also receive \$400 worth of children's books.
